The mission of the Volunteer Center of Cedar Valley is to promote and support effective volunteerism and to serve as the resource and coordination center for volunteers and community partnerships.

What We Do

- **In partnership with more than 180-member agencies**, we mobilize people and resources to deliver creative solutions to community problems.
- **Within Cedar Valley schools**, we offer service-learning to educate youth about volunteerism and their responsibility to create positive change in their community.
- **We serve our non-profit member agencies** by offering training courses, providing a website to serve as a clearinghouse for volunteer opportunities, highlighting opportunities for partnership across agencies, and offering consultation on the issues of volunteer recruitment, retention and recognition.
- **In partnership with the University of Northern Iowa**, we co-host the UNI Volunteer Fair and assist UNI students in securing volunteer placement in our satellite office located at UNI and provide opportunities for the Martin Luther King Jr. National Day of Service event that more than 500 students participate annually.
- **To recognize the efforts of area volunteers** we sponsor the Mayors' Volunteer and Top Teen Awards each spring.
